Reflections

Focus Groups of 2018

In August 2018, the congregation held "Focus Groups" where five topics were discussed: spiritual growth, membership, visibility, fellowship, and nurture. These groups were to make suggestions to help the congregation move forward. Some of the ideas were doable right away while others, it was realized, would take time.

Spiritual Growth

A priority for this group was the hope that formal prayer groups would be formed to pray for the congregation, the wider church, and the world. (One such group eventually met and prayed together for a time, but it has since disbanded). It was suggested that the congregation develop small groups; that the congregation be stricter in choosing deacons and elders that lead servant-leadership lifestyles, act as Christian role models that others look to, and meet on a regular basis for study and prayer; that the people of the congregation "learn the Bible" and become more committed, passionate, and "hungry for God's word."

Membership and Visibility

These two groups essentially came up with similar plans. There was agreement that the church's exposure would increase with social media such as Facebook. Other suggestions to increase visibility included: putting up a digital sign, putting in a book station, having a concert on the lawn, begin a "Friends of Troop 157" group, becoming more involved in the community such as Family Promise (plans continue to develop).

Fellowship

Ideas to increase our church fellowship included: once-a-month game nights alternating with movie nights; outdoor BBQ's, before and after worship coffee, inside picnics during colder months, blessing of the pets on St. Francis Day, small group activities (fitness, day journeys, movies), progressive dinners, setting up a quilt or puzzle where anyone can work on them, Old-fashioned Singalongs, and mission projects.

Nurture

This group felt that it is very important for individuals to recognize their spiritual gifts to find a good fit for ministries, to call on members in person or by phone, offer rides to church and events, and organizing a shepherd ministry (primarily with the elders).

While certain aspects of these suggestions have been realized, others are still formulating. God is working in us and through us to bring the peace of Christ to every individual, even amid our experiences through the pandemic. This is a good time to plan fellowship events and small groups for when you emerge from isolation. God is with you and loves you.

As God moves you into future ministry, my prayer is that you will come together regularly to include these five areas of the Christian life into your walk with God and each other in ways you know and in ways you have yet to discover.



Spotlight on Disciples

Three Missional Implications in Baptism

1. We are compelled to oppose discrimination based on such things as race, gender, and economic status. We identify simply as Christians. Our distinctiveness is that we are baptized into Christ—any devaluation of those who are different from ourselves has been overcome (see Galatians 3:27-28). We are all Christians, some of us are female while others are male. Some of us are Caucasian while others are Hispanic, Asian, or African. Kinnamon and Linn state, “Racism, sexism, and classism in church and society are abominations to God that we oppose, not because we are good people, but because our very identity is at stake. That’s what it means to be baptized.”
2. We are bound in solidarity with Christians who suffer or celebrate anywhere in the world, near or far—when one suffers, the entire Christian body suffers, when one is honored, the entire body rejoices (see 1 Corinthians 12:12-31). We demonstrate the same care for each child of God. “That’s what it means to be baptized.”
3. We are enabled through God’s grace to reject idolatry. Paul reflects on the transformation we all receive at our baptisms (see Romans 6). Through baptism, the enslaving power of sin is broken. In our new morality, our lives are defined by Christ, not worldly idols such as money or power. “That’s what it means to be baptized.”
