



The Lord's Supper: One table, Many Guests

The Lord's Supper as Identity-Giving

Being "people of the table" is more than a slogan for us, and the chalice is more than a denominational symbol. Both underscore the fact that the Lord's Supper identifies something very basic about who we are as a community of faith. One, that we are a community of faith that is more than individuals gathered together. Part of what defines us as church is that we are one body, not one person. Coming around the table is tangible expression of this reality. Two, we are people for whom worships seems incomplete without Communion. That is because it reminds us that we are Christians whose mission is to witness to the power of God to reconcile all humanity to one another because we all belong to God.
